## The Yawanawá

There are about 1200 Yawanawá living in the Brazilian state of Acre, in villages along the banks of the Gregório river, where they have made their homes since time immemorial.

The Yawanawá people's first contact with the non-indigenous world happened around the fourteenth century. It was an intense period of much conflict with the rubber barons and missionaries who invaded their lands and tried to forbid Yawanawá language, culture and spirituality. In the 1980s, chief Biraci Nixiwaka Brazil led his people in the struggle for the recognition of their native territories, and the Yawanawá became the first indigenous people to obtain the official rights to their lands in the state of Acre.

The Yawanawá have since then reclaimed their sacred medicines, rituals, song and dance, festivals, games, traditional body painting and adornment, artwork and food, in a profound journey of cultural revival.



# The Sacred Village

The Yawanawa Emã Sheni Shushuti celebration will take place in the ancestral village of the Yawanawa People- The Sacred Village. The Sacred Village (Aldeia Sagrada) is the sacred ancestral sanctuary of the Yawanawa from the times when the entire tribe lived together united in a single village. It is there where the burial grounds of the Yawanawa elders and Pajes (Shamans) exist until today.

It was in the Sacred Village that the first contact with Western society was made. This contact marked the beginning of an era of repression by the missionaries and an era of enslavement for the exploitation of rubber. Decades later, when the Yawanawa regained the rights to their land, they stopped living in the Sacred Village and began to open new villages and re-writing their history. A great revival of Yawanawa culture, customs and spirituality took place and today the Yawanawa are living a new time.

The Sacred Village is the Spiritual center of Yawanawa culture; it is the place where all apprentices on the path of Yawanawa Spirituality undergo their Spiritual trainings and 'dietas' to become Pajes (Shamans). The land is blessed with fertile soil and rich biodiversity, including a large garden of medicinal plants preserving Yawanawa Ancestral Botanical plant knowledge.



Today,

access to the Sacred Village is granted only in times of prayer and diet. For the occasion of this celebration, we will have the unique opportunity and immense privilege to embark on a deep Spiritual Journey while immersing in Yawanawá culture and Celebration within their most sacred territory.

During the Emã Sheni Shushuti celebration we will be received by a warm team of caretakers, including a Professional holistic Chef, Plant Medicine doctors, Pajes (Shamans) from several Yawanawa villages including Nova Esperança and Mutum, as well as young upcoming leaders of the community.

All will be working alongside Putanny Yawanawá, her husband Chief Nixiwaka Biraci Brazil, their son Biraci Iskunkua Junior, their son in law Paje Peu and their daughters Nawashahu, Ykashahu and Mukashahu who will be

guiding our journey as a family.



# Putanny Yawanawá

Yawanawá spirituality is a sacred territory where never a woman had dared to step, for since ancestral times, it had belonged exclusively to men.

In 2005, two women, Putanny and her sister Hushahu, were the first women to make the sacred oath of the Yawanawa people.. They have since been recognized as the first women to undergo Yawanawá spiritual training. After a year of strict diet, they earned their communities' respect as spiritual leaders, and opened the way into this sacred path for many other Yawanawá women. A break in tradition that united the male and female universes - and brought the magic of feminine spirituality to strengthen the Yawanawá culture.

Since 2016, Putanny has been receiving visitors in the Nova Esperança village, for an immersion in Yawanawa Spirituality in the form of a Healing Retreat. Participation in these Retreats, as well as in this Celebration, contribute to the construction, maintenance and development of the Sacred Village Ceremonial Center currently being built.



# Biraci Brasil Nixiwaka

Chief Biraci Nixiwaka is one of the most relevant indigenous leaders of our time. He has dedicated his life to empowering his people and reclaiming their ancient culture and spirituality.

He was instrumental in having his people, the Yawanawa, be the first Indigenous tribe in Brazil to have their lands officially demarcated. After reconquering the rights over their land, encompassing 200 hectares of virgin forest in the heart of the Amazon, Nixiwaka, alongside his family, led the opening of their cultures to the world. He founded 'Nova Esperança' (New Hope) village, and created the Yawa Festival, which has been happening annually for the past 16 years, in celebration of Yawanawa traditions.

Nixiwaka oversees the development of many projects in his community, including the current project of rebuilding the Sacred Village, ensuring cultural preservation and the sustainable management of their ecological sanctuary. He is an exceptional orator, riveting story teller and a true visionary of the New Times humanity is presently embarking upon.
